Disability SnowSport UK and volunteers from Bolton School are working together to offer any resident of Bolton with a disability the opportunity to experience the thrill of skiing.

We would love to hear from children and adults (especially those aged 11-25) who would like to take part in free a taster session at the Chill Factor:

You are welcome to try this as a 'one off', but if you discover that this may be the sport for you, then we will organise a course of lessons with fully qualified adaptive ski instructors (funded by Sportivate). Courses will start in January 2014.

Who can ski? We firmly believe that anyone can learn to ski. Disability Snowsport UK provides qualified instructors specialising in adaptive skiing. Couple this with hi-tech adaptive equipment, then snowsports become open to all.

We have skiers with a range of disabilities,. Some are stand up skiers, others use sit skis either on their own or with the support of a trained volunteer or adaptive coach.
